March Field Trip - Wekiwa Springs State Park

Come join the fun trip on Saturday March 18th at Wekiwa Springs State Park. Bob Wheeler has put together some nice experiences for us including starting the day with a mist net and banding demonstration! It is very interesting to see how highly trained bird specialists handle, identify, and band these birds for research purposes. It is amazing how gentle and effective they are with our tiny friends. Seeing a Thrush, Cardinal, Wren or Warbler up close and personal is amazing! The remainder of the trip will consist of driving and shorter walks to different habitats. If you are not able to walk, you can still see many areas from very near the

cars. I should also point out that the banding station is only 75 feet from a paved access road. You may want a fold up chair for this part.

For this trip, meet at the Albertson's parking lot at the corner of 434 and Wekiwa Springs Blvd in Longwood at 7:30 am. We will leave by 8 am. Any questions before the trip you can call Bob Wheeler home 407-869-0303. Directions or problems on the day of the trip use cell # 407-739-0333. We will carpool from Albertson's to the park. There might be a nominal charge to enter the park. Bring a snack lunch to enjoy after the trip.

Nominating Committee Hard at Work

The task of finding a slate for the Orange Audubon Society annual elections in April falls mostly on the shoulders of our nominating committee, consisting this year of Betty Seegers (407-351-3624), Tom Williams (407-332-5089) and Dick Smith, Chairman (407-257-7361 or dick.smith@zepamfg.com). This year is the biennial election of five officers, who serve two-year terms, as well as the election of at least five of the other fifteen members of the board of directors, who serve three-year terms. There may be a need for more than five board members due to resignations of current members who are no longer able to fulfill their three-year term obligations (e.g. the member has moved into an officer position, is unable to attend board meetings, is unable to contribute as a board member, etc.).

The president of the organization, especially, relies on the other officers and the complete board of fifteen members to facilitate the task of 'running' the society. I have had an especially good board of directors for the past four years and really appreciate those individuals who have stepped forward to assist in keeping Orange Audubon Society an active and successful chapter of National Audubon Society and Audubon of Florida.

Is it time for you to consider benefitting your society by serving on the board of directors? To make it easier for 'newcomers' to the board, remember that usually only 5

directors' chairs are due to be elected each year, leaving 10 seats (plus the officers) of 'experienced' directors. Additionally, remember that each board member was new to the board at one time, so don't be afraid that you'll be too 'green' to be of service; every one of you has some special talent that can be put to use for the worthy cause.

February Hawk ID Course

The weather decided to give eighteen members and friends a great day to spend "learning our Hawks" at the Lake Apopka Restoration Area (LARA). With Bob Sanders' lead, we recorded 56 bird species including seven raptors. Highlights of the day were the Peregrine Falcon and some less common variants of Red-Tailed Hawks, including Krider's form.

LARA continues to be a joy to visit as it gives us encounters with multiple bird species at once, allowing for great teaching comparisons. We also were able to view examples of birds at many ages and from many angles, allowing all us to come away with more confidence in identifying raptors. As a bonus, we also saw Grasshopper Sparrow, Purple Gallinule, and Forster's Tern. We even watched an American Kestrel try to steal a mouse from a Red-tailed Hawk. Once again, thank you to Bob Sanders for giving us his Saturday and teaching us about his favorite birds.
